Fraternally, Bulletin/Calendar Editor Stan Leong, GK Catholics Urged to Help Build a Culture of Peace – Knights of Columbus invite Catholics worldwide to join in praying the rosary for peace on feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

NEW YORK CITY - Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson has called on "all Catholics to

work together with all people of good will to build a global culture of peace."

"Peace is not a utopian dream. It is a worthy and reachable goal," Anderson said in remarks before the Path to Peace Foundation. The Path to Peace Foundation this year awarded its Champion of Peace Award to the Knights of Columbus. The Knights were cited by the foundation for "uncompromising defense of human life and the family." Archbishop Renato R. Martino, apostolic nuncio of the Holy See's mission at the United Nations and president of the Path to Peace Foundation, presented the award.

In working toward that goal of building a culture of peace, Anderson announced a major initiative by the Knights of Columbus: " On Dec. 12, the feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Knights of Columbus and their families will pray the rosary for peace with justice throughout the world and we invite all Catholics to join us."

Addressing the foundation at a ceremony in New York City Nov. 26, Anderson also referred to the "horrifying" terrorist acts "that took so many innocent lives" there. Even as we respond to those attacks, Anderson noted, the cause of peace must be pursued: "Tonight, while our military forces act to defend our nation against those who continue to threaten to harm us, we come here to rededicate ourselves to the cause of peace. And it is right that we should do so."

The Path to Peace Foundation is a nonprofit foundation established to provide support for the Permanent Observer Mission of the Holy See to the United Nations in promoting the Church's message of peace. Through its programs, chiefly at the United Nations, the Path to Peace Foundation attempts to keep the Gospel message before the international community and assist the pope in encouraging all toward peaceful resolution of conflicts.
