BLUE MASS FEBRUARY 23, 2002

The events of September 11th have left a profound impact on all of us here in Canada and throughout the world. Many of the firefighters, police officers and emergency workers who perished in the horrific event of September 11th in New York, were members of the Knights of Columbus.

As a show of our solidarity with our brothers in the firefighters, law enforcement and emergency services, Archbishop Duke Council 6855 in conjunction with Canadian Martyrs Council 11916 hosted a Blue Mass on Saturday February 23rd, 2002 at 9:00 AM at St. Paul's Church.

Members of the local police, firefighters and emergency services were invited and as many as 25 attend this service in memory of those who paid the supreme sacrifice on September 11th, as well as for all those who have died in the course of their duties. This first-ever Blue Mass is a Supreme Council initiative, involving the 13,000 councils worldwide and the 116 councils in the BC & Yukon jurisdiction. Fr. Lawrence Donnelly celebrated the Mass. In his homily, he thanked the firefighters, police and emergency workers for their selfless dedication in the pursuit of their duties. He reminded everyone that no matter how horrific the event; we must not have hate in our hearts, yet justice must be meted out to those responsible.

A large number Knights comprised of members from 6855, 11916, 12861 and 10681 showed their solidarity by attending the mass along with the 200 or more parishioners who attend the Saturday morning mass. The Blue Mass will be an annual event.
