91st BC & YUKON STATE CONVENTION

Bro. Gaston DuPaul and I were the two delegates from 6855 who attended the Convention at the end of April. This year, our council was not directly involved with hosting the Convention, and as such it was much more relaxing for us, even though as GK of 6855, I was tasked with chairing and presenting the Credentials Committee report at the opening of the Business session.

The Opening Mass on Friday was concelebrated by Bishop Raymond Roussin, SM and 17 to 18 Priests. It was a real boost to have so many Clergy present to give their support to the Order, as it would set the tone for the rest of the Convention. Our Choir - joined by various other brother Knights – was in good voice and was well received at all three Masses.

After the opening Mass, our State Deputy welcomed the Richmond City Councillor, Mr. Kiichi Kumagai, who represented the Richmond Mayor.

As is customary, the State Deputy declared the first Session as an "Open Session" so wives and friends could be present. Speeches were kept short and interesting. The young Chief Squire and Chief Squirettee were both dynamic and well received.

The Friday Night Dinner/Dance was very well attended. The theme for the evening was "Red & White" and everyone was dressed for the occasion — some costumes were very imaginative. Everyone enjoyed the buffet dinner. The live band (teachers from Holy Cross High School) played excellent music and they had quite a repertoire to select from.

The Saturday Session began at 8:00 am with a roll call. Out of the 116 councils, there were quite a few councils that did not attend. The State Deputies from Idaho, Oregon and Washington were present as well as the Deputy Supreme Knight Jean Migneault. The Credentials Committee then presented the report. The State Officers gave their summation

of their report on the year's activities (as previously circulated in the Convention package), placing heavy emphasis and importance on the following: prompt submission of reports, recruitment of younger members & retention of members, need to be family oriented, promote Vocations, and be visible in the Church and Community. There were three new councils formed: Bishop McCarthy #13040, St. Marks & Corpus Christi College # 13101, St. Mary's #13072 and one reactivated: Santa Maria #4582. The State Directors & Chairmen then presented their reports (a copy will be available at the Gen. Meeting)

Fr. Fred Weisbeck spoke very eloquently of the need to be in solidarity with our Bishops and Priests and to pray for them.

On Saturday afternoon, there was the awards presentation. We won the Francis J. McKinnon – Outstanding Life Issues Activity Award (for our call to serve stranded passengers due to Sept 11th). We were 3rd runner up for Pennies for Heaven with a contribution of \$2986.48. The winner was council 9451 Pope John I (Aldergrove), with \$4744.58. The Necrology Mass was concelebrated by Bishop Raymond Roussin, other Bishops and 12 to 14 Priests. Brother John FitzGibbon PGK was among the deceased whose names were read out at the Mass.

This year we had about a half hour to socialize with the other Richmond councils in the hospitality room put on by 10681. We did find a volunteer to secure a table large enough for our group. A total of \$102, 822.00 from "Pennies for Heaven" was presented to the Bishops for Vocations. The Grand Knight of the Year award went to GK of 9479 Benjamin Francisco, District Deputy of the Year went to DD#21 Ed Landry and Family of the Year went to Guy and Beverly Supeene of council 6767 Abbotsford. The Guest Speaker was Jean Migneault, Deputy Supreme Knight who gave long but very inspiring speech. The evening ended with only about a half hour of dancing as most people were too tired to stay and dance.

Out of the net profit of \$432, 150.75 from Charity Appeal, the rebate to our council this year is \$3486.65 for the 620.4 books sold. We sold 780.7 books last year. The top seller was Chilliwack council 3478 with 1939.3 books. The highest individual seller was Jean Cote' of Prince George council 8046, with 772 books.

There were several contentious resolutions and much discussion. Most were adopted as recommended, except for #7 which was defeated and #10 was adopted as further amended. There were two late resolutions that were also adopted. The

session closed at 12:30 pm. The Convention committee under Larry Fraser did a great job organizing the venue.

IN MEMORIAM

PGK & Bro. John FitzGibbon passed away on April 6, 2002. Prayer service was held on April 8 and funeral service was held at St. Paul's Church on April 9, 2002 with the 4th Degree providing Honor Guard. Bro. John was Grand Knight of 6855 from 1989-1991 and was instrumental in the formation of Christopher Columbus Council 10681. Bro. John was much loved and will be sorely missed. May he rest in peace, Amen.
