This year marks the 100th anniversary of International Women's Day, first created through an initiative at the International Conference of Working Women in Copenhagen in 1910 on the part of German socialist leader Clara Zetkin (1857-1933). Zetkin saw women's liberation as an integral part of the struggle for socialism, and envisioned IWD as a way for women worldwide to air their grievances, aspirations and achievements. The first IWD was held on March 19, 1911 (moved to March 8 in 1913), and is now celebrated by millions of women and men the world over.
