## Sunday, August 28

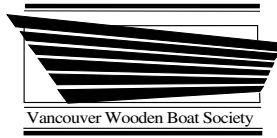

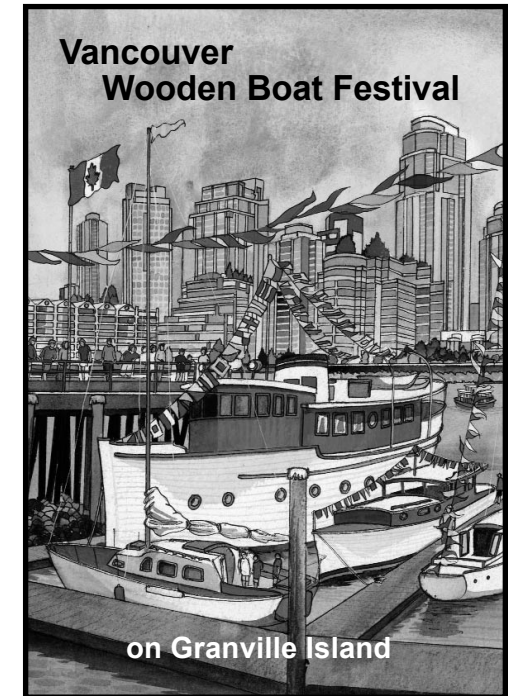

Most events and activities run throughout the day but impromptu and unexpected maritime madness could occur anywhere at any time!

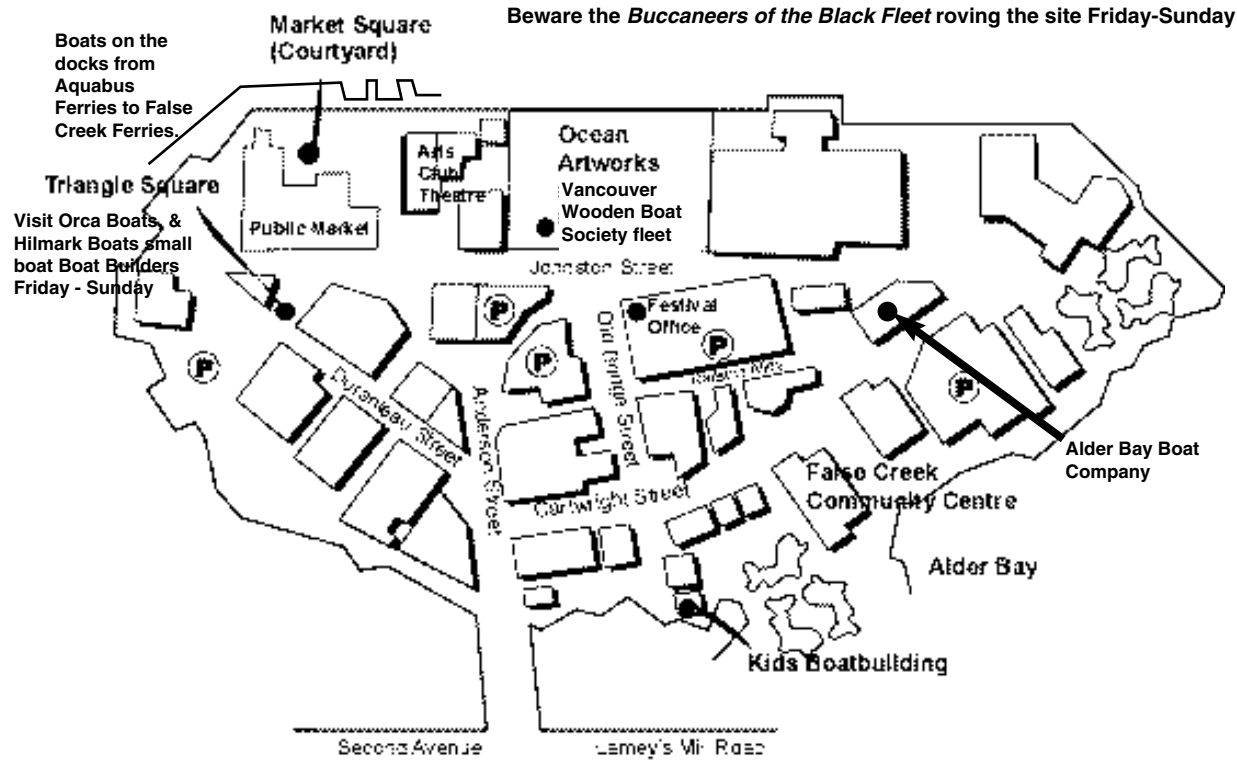
- Beware the roving *Buccaneers of the Black Fleet* — maritime scalliwags all!!!
- floating exhibition of wooden boats of all kinds at the Granville Island public docks on the north and west sides of the Public Market. Cast your vote for the “People’s Choice Award”
- visit the Ocean Artworks space and visit the Vancouver Wooden Boat Society’s fleet.
- On display — Exhibitors include:

**BC Viking Ship Society**, Vancouver, BC – join society members with *Munin*, the 40’ - 1/2 scale model of a Viking ship powered by oars and sail. If you are lucky you will get to be a part of a rollicking raid - viking style.

**Britannia Heritage Shipyard National Historic Site**, Richmond, BC – society members will present a glimpse into the past of shipbuilding in Steveston on board the *Silver Ann*

**Canadian Power and Sail Squadron**, Vancouver, B.C. — promoting safe boating and education.

**Daria Duprey**, Vancouver, BC – is a fibre artisan who creates with fun and juicy colours. She transforms vintage and contemporary fabrics into textural and playful hats and accessories.



**Graham Eagle**, North Van, BC – award winning and custom-made wall sculptures combine numerous personal themes (nautical and others) with humour and a building facade, to create a distinctive "architectural portrait".

**Fertile Images & Design**, Vancouver, BC – “Somewhere down the Fraser river” From Finn Slough to Britannia Shipyard to Steveston Harbour. Zak Sarwari’s good old-fashioned film photographs will bring back memories in cards, prints, canvases and framed creations.

**Endless Knots By David** – He shares his passion for practical knotwork and decorative celtic art in knots. Demonstrations and lessons.

**Georgia Strait Alliance**, Nanaimo, BC - Join Mike Richards to learn ways you personally can help save the Strait of Georgia at home, in your boat or wherever you dine out.

**Hilmark Boats**, Campbell River, BC — Join Boat builder Hilford Burton as he displays a Tyee row boat and a day-sailer built at his shop in Campbell River.

**Orca Canoes & Kayaks**, Coquitlam, B.C. – Rod Tait designs, builds and sells plans for hand crafted cedar strip canoes and kayaks.

**Plunger Cove Studio**, North Van., B.C. — one-of-a-kind whimsical folk-art boats, - each handmade with materials scavenged from local

beaches and constructions sites.

**SS Master Society** – Join the crew for a rollicking tour of the *SS Master*. Hear some great stories of this lovely little piece of maritime history.

**Silva Bay Shipyard School**, Gabriola Island BC – join school staff and find out more about our only full time boatbuilding school.

**Treespirit Carvings**, Vancouver BC – Join Denis Gobeil with his whimsical faces carved in cottonwood bark - called treespirits!

**Vancouver Maritime Museum**, The Museum showcases the rich maritime history and traditions of the Pacific Coast. Museum volunteers will be onboard the *SS Master*.

**Vancouver Wooden Boat Society**, Vancouver, BC – Festival information booths – the organization behind the annual Vancouver Wooden Boat Festival on Granville Island.
