Control and Information System for Perseus and Jason SolarCell (SOLCIS)

1. General Requirement Stargate Enterprises has a requirement for a SOLCIS, which is to take SolarCell outputs and digitise them where necessary, so that power output is maintained between set limits. In addition, the SOLCIS is to monitor all key metrics and, using fuzzy logic, continuously assess the combinational chance of any set of metrics indicating a functional problem with the SolarCell. The SOLCIS is to calculate the statistical probability of out-of-tolerance metrics and establish a set of criteria against which to assess the functional state of the SolarCell in levels of:

GREEN - meaning within a calculated safety margin of functional acceptability;

AMBER - meaning outside the safety margin established for the GREEN state, but still functionally acceptable. The MISSED is to declare the metrics that are out of the safety margin and make recommendations to management for immediate corrective action to return the SolarCell to a GREEN condition.
