PD DAYS PLANNED FOR 2003

The minimum goal of the Society is to hold three Professional Development Seminars in each calendar year. This allows a Vancouver area PMP to meet the re-certification requirements from this source of PDUs alone.

In 2002 we held five, full-day seminars and would like to do so again in 2003. This year, we have held seminars in January, April, and June.

Every PMP is a candidate presenter, facilitator, or committee member. However, a seminar will proceed only if a volunteer Project Manager for the event steps forward. You have the opportunity to pick the theme and topic, and to pick a convenient date. We aim for the fourth Wednesday of the month.

Here is the line-up for 2003 at the moment:

October - Project Management Competency, Training, Education and Development

November 26 - Open - Annual Meeting of the Society

Seminar participants can claim seven PDUs for the day. We now have confirmation from PMI on the PDUs that presenters, facilitators, and the PM can claim, in addition to the time they spend as participants.

PDU OPPORTUNITIES FOR SEMINAR MANAGEMENT TEAM

As it turns out, a short term volunteer assignment (other than serving as a presenter or workshop organizer) does not entitle one to PDUs. Our earlier publicity announcements have indicated otherwise, and we apologize for that.

The excerpt from the Continuing Certification Requirements Handbook below suggests that a committee member must participate for a minimum of three months. We believe it is fair for the PM of a professional development seminar to claim the one PDU (big deal!) since the time span from initial planning through to closing out the accounts and issuing the evaluation report typically is three months. Each committee member will have to assess her or his own involvement and decide whether it constituted three months of participation.

Category 5: Service to Professional or Community Organizations

- . Serve as a committee member for a project management organization.
- Minimum three months of participation. One PDU per calendar year. (No PDUs are awarded for service less than three months.)
- Minimum six months of participation. Three PDUs per calendar year.
- Twelve months of participation. Five PDUs per calendar year.

An important benefit of the program of professional development seminars which we have been able to put on through the Society has been the opportunity for PMPs to acquire PDUs for their attendance at the event, at a very reasonable cost, and we are able to do this because it is a volunteer endeavour.
