US\$75 Recertification Fee in 2004

PMI has announced that there will be a fee for PMP re-certification, starting in the new year, of US\$75 for PMI members (\$150 for non-members)

You can apply for re-certification as soon as you have accumulated 60 PDUs. You do not have to wait until the end of your three-year cycle. You may be able to save the fee by applying for re-certification before year-end 2003 if you qualify.
