RISK IDENTIFICATION & LESSONS LEARNED - Ivan Kuun, PMP has put together a risk based workshop compiled from his many years of manufacturing experience. His workshop will highlight some of the many pitfalls involved with projects that can quickly get "off-track" if not managed properly from the beginning. The workshop will provoke discussion and will solicit your responses for risk identification. After the feedback is assembled he will reveal the lessons that he has personally learned when faced with similar situations.

THE COST MODEL AS A DEVELOPMENT AND OPERATIONAL TOOL IN A MANUFACTURING SETTING - Elizabeth Dillon, PMP will demonstrate the subtleties of a cost tracking model that was developed specifically within her company to accurately determine that cost of the products at the various stage of production within their facility.
