#### S A S background

*SAS Calgary* has operated successfully since 1989, and currently operates three safe houses, eleven transitional apartments, eight independent long-term apartments, six co-operative for-profit businesses, one babysitting service, and the ASK Learning Centre.

A small light flickered in 1986 as Servants Anonymous (S.A.) started the seed for their World Services to bring to life their vision for change that would provide a way out for those trapped in sexual exploitation. It began in 1988 in Calgary, and the flame has extended to Kelowna, Surrey, and even to the frontiers of Nepal and Thailand. Today, SA World Services is continuing to disseminate their concept to service delivery for sexually exploited women and children throughout the world at large.

#### S A S story

SAS - Servants Anonymous Society (Surrey) was founded in October 2000 and was incorporated as a BC Registered Society on November 6, 2000. We have a charitable tax number for tax-deductible donations.

The SAS Surrey program is designed as an original self-help approach to recovery for female youth. The program provides sexually exploited females with secure housing and a lifeskills program (the ASK Learning Centre). The ASK Learning Centre is designed to provide each participant with an opportunity to learn the personal and occupational skills required to help them obtain and maintain employment, return to school, and/or raise their children on a full-time basis.

Funding for various programs, projects, training, and supplies is provided through the generousity of private and corporate donations.
